

ANIMAL KEEPING BYLAW NO. 2(81)

A Bylaw of the TOWN of OUTLOOK providing limited restrictions for the keeping of livestock, poultry and bees within the corporate limits of the TOWN of OUTLOOK pursuant to Section 165 of the Urban Municipality Act, Chapter U-10, R.S.S. 1978.

The Council of the TOWN of OUTLOOK enacts as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS.

- (a). "Livestock" as used in this bylaw shall mean cattle, goats, sheep, swine, horses and all fur bearing animals whether kept for profit or pleasure; but does not include pet(s),
- (b). "Poultry" shall mean chickens, ducks, geese and turkeys,
- (c). "RA-Residential Acreage District" means a zoning district established by the TOWN of OUTLOOK Zoning Bylaw and amendments thereto.
- (d). "Pet" means any animal(s) or bird(s) that are:
 - (i) tamed or domesticated and kept as a companion and;
 - (ii) not raised for profit and;
 - (iii) not customarily raised for human consumption.

2. No person(s) shall keep livestock, poultry or bees within the corporate limits of the TOWN of OUTLOOK save and except for those areas designated by the Zoning Bylaw as being in the RA-Residential Acreage District where,
- (a). a maximum of three (3) adult horses per hectare are permitted;
 - (b). the horses are kept penned, fenced or tethered entirely on their owners' property when left untended;
 - (c). horse manure shall not be permitted to accumulate so as to provide a nuisance;
 - (d). a rodent control program shall be maintained and;
 - (e). dead animals shall be removed and disposed of as required by regulations under the Public Health Act.

3. (a). On its own initiative or after having reviewed: a report from the local Medical Health Officer; a report from the local Farm Engineering Specialist employed by the Saskatchewan Department of Agriculture and/or; a petition signed by any neighbouring residents, Council may revoke the privilege of any person(s) to keep any livestock or pet(s) in the RA-Residential Acreage District.
- (b). Where Council revokes the animal keeping privilege, Council or their agent shall serve, by registered mail and/or in person, the owner or occupier with a letter of notice stating the reasons for Council's decision. The recipient of Council's letter of notice shall, within thirty days of receiving the notice, either take what action Council deems necessary to correct, resolve and alleviate the reason(s) for Council's decision or cease the keeping of livestock or pet(s).
- (c). Where the aforementioned recipient fails to comply with Council's directive(s), Council may direct their agent(s) to take what ever action they deem necessary to correct, resolve and alleviate the reasons for Council's decision, the costs of which will be the responsibility of the recipient in addition to the following penalties.

4. In addition to the above provisions, any person(s) contravening any provisions of this bylaw shall be subject to the General Penalties Bylaw of the TOWN of OUTLOOK.

5. This Bylaw will come into force on the date of its final passing.
