

"Bylaw No.2/65"

A bylaw to close certain streets and lanes in the Town of Outlook. Whereas it is deemed expedient by the Council of the Town of Outlook to cancel a plan of survey of record in the Land Titles Office for the Saskatoon Land Registration District as No. G.411. NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Outlook in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. That all that portion of Hall Street lying between the Sotherly limit of Fourth Avenue and the Northerly limit of Third Avenue and being lots 1 to 32 in Block 17 Palm G.411 together with all of the lane in Block 17 Plan G.411.
  2. That all that portion of Cross Street lying between the Southern boundary of Fourth Avenue and the Northern boundary of Third Avenue being lots 1 to 32 inclusive in Block 22 and lots 1 to 32 inclusive in Block 23 Plan G.411. That Block 17 and Block 22 be consolidated in one title.
  3. That all that portion of Maple Street lying between the southern boundary of Fourth Avenue and the northern boundary of Third Avenue being lots 1 to 32 inclusive in Block 28, Plan G.411 and all of the lane in Block 28, Plan G.411 and lots 1 to 16 inclusive in Block 29 Plan G.411 and all of the lane in Block 29 Palm G.411. That Blocks 23, 28, and 29 with their lot cancellations and street closures to be consolidated in one title.
  4. All of the above is Pt. of the East Half of Section Twenty-one(21) in Township Twenty-Nine(29) in Range Eight(8) West of the Third Meridian.
- This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on, from and after final passing thereof.

Town workmen to be instructed to proceed to Betalock on 19 Feb. 1965.

RESOLUTIONS:

- (1) That the plans as presented by the Fire Dept., be used as a basis to be presented to Architects for plans on a new Fire Hall.
- (2) That all town and other sewer and water services excepting those used solely by sewer and water Dept., be assessed according to rate schedule & P.P.P. be assessed a reasonable hydrant rental.
- (3) That we revise our water and sewer accounting as approved by the Dept. of Municipal Affairs.
- (4) Authorization be given Cannon & Baker to complete negotiations with Réverview Golf Club as outlined in the June 20th meeting, 1963.
- (5) That the account to Bergstrom's Brake & Drum Service for the amount of \$133.25 be paid.

DIRECTIVES:

1. A.E.S.I. letter re: Paving project, be filed.
2. S.U.M.A. letter Re: Convention be tabled.
3. Agreement between Town & Arena Committee be filed.

Mayor CARTER & Cr. MacDonald related facts as to correspondence and information at hand relative to negotiations with Dr. Sawa, D.D.S. of Toronto, Dental Student enquiring as to practice in Outlook.

Resolution No. 6: "In event any domestic sewage service becomes obstructed, the town will absorb the cost of clearing upon certification by the plumber employed that the said obstruction originated in the town portion of the system."
