Notices From Public Works Department

Spring Clean Up Weekend

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic we have had to postpone the Spring Clean Up Weekend until further notice. **W**e will advertise the make-up date as soon as it has been decided on.

Branch Pick Up

Branch pick up will be taking place from May 19th to May 22nd, and then again Sept 8th to Sept 11th. If there are storms that have caused an excessive amount of falling branches, they will be picked up as needed.

Compost Pick Up

Compost pick up will begin Monday April 6th. Lawn clippings, leaves and other garden refuse may be left in a neat pile or placed in a bin (lid off). We do prefer that compost not be placed in plastic bags as they tend to be blown away after they have been emptied. If you do have the compost in a bag, please leave it open so that it can be distinguished from regular garbage. Please have compost ready for pick-up by 8:00am Monday mornings to ensure pick-up during the week. If you notice that your compost hasn't been collected for over a week please inform the Town Office. Please remember to separate branches from regular compost to avoid your compost not being picked up.

Communal Cardboard Bin

The communal cardboard bin at the landfill is free to use to residents for the one-off large cardboard box that may not fit into your blue recycling cart. If you have more than this, you can expect to be charged \$30 per $\frac{1}{2}$ ton. If you do take cardboard out to the landfill please ensure it is cut into smaller pieces in an effort to fill the bin to capacity. Please note that the bin is not available for businesses to use.

Garbage Pick Up

All residents who would normally have garbage pick up on Wednesdays, please note that your July 1^{st} pick up will be moved to July 2^{nd} .

To Flush Or Not To Flush

More people than usual will be using disinfectant wipes right now. Please know that wastewater plants have trouble processing them. They need to be disposed of in the garbage...not flushed down toilets. ALL wipes, including baby wipes, flushable wipes, napkins, paper towels and tissues clog up pipes, pumps and equipment at the wastewater plant.

Dutch Elm Disease

Dutch Elm Disease (DED) is caused by a fungus spread by tiny elm bark beetles that breed under the bark of dead or dying elm wood. If that wood contains DED fungus, each new generation of beetles can infect healthy elms.

You can help prevent DED by;

- Keep your own elm trees healthy;
- Don't prune Elm trees from April 1st to August 31st;
- If you see signs of DED, report them to the Public Works Department;
- Don't buy, sell, store, transport or use elm firewood; it's illegal;
- Remove and dispose of the tree promptly if DED is confirmed;
- Support DED management in your community.

The town has contracted KBM Resources Group to inspect and mark trees infected by DED.
